

While at Skidegate I find that the new teacher and nurse are doing good work, and they are weall liked by all. They are both staying at the Mission house with the clergyman's family, and this does not seem to be a very happy arrangement, and at the same time it is too much to be expected of Mrs. Matthews for she has a family of three children. This arrangement of boarding at the Mission house has caused truble in previous years. Hence the reason for my putting in an estimate for a teacher's residence, in the annual estimates for 1925-29. I feel however, that something will have to be done before a permanent residence can be built. I would like to suggest that the Department surply furniture so that the Murse and Teacher can live together in a building which I can secure for them. This would be a temporary arrangement, but the furniture could be such that it can be used later in a new residence, if the Department desires to errect a new building. I would suggest the following items,

Cooking stove. 50.00

Heating stove. 15.00

Two beds complete. 40.00

Linoleum. 15.00

Three chairs. 6.00

Sir:

I have your letter, undated, in which you recommend that authority be granted you to purchase certain furnishings to fit up a residence for the teacher and murse at Skidegate and also to supply fuel, etc. In this connection I beg to confirm the following night-lettergram to you of yesterday's date: -

*Reference your letter recent date you may prepare house for teacher and nurse at Skidegate, purchase furniture and fuel at an approximate total cost of \$250.

In the purchase of the various articles of furniture and improving of the condition of the house, the expense should be kept down to the lowest possible point. After the furnishings have arrived and the house has been improved and the fuel obtained, you should forward accounts, in duplicate, properly certified, covering the expense.

It is noted that the present arrangements for the boarding of the teacher and nurse are unsatisfactory and that you will be able to obtain a building which can be fitted up as a residence for them. I shall be pleased if you will furnish particulars regarding this house, stating its present condition and whether it will be necessary to pay rental for same or not. It is thought that if the house which you can obtain is satisfactory, after slight repairs, it might be possible to purchase same or arrange for its rental for a term of years and have any repairs required carried out in order to provide suitable future accommodation for the teacher and nurse at this point. Please report regarding this matter.

Re Residence for Nurse and Teacher, Skidegate .

Replying to your letter I57-II-8, Dec 29th, I beg to report that the house sectived for the teacher and nusre at Skidegate is one which originally belonged to a mining company who had a lease from the Band near the village. In default of payment, the Council took possession of the house and moved it onto the Reserve. This was doen several years ago. Miss Andrews lived in it for a time. It is a two-roome frame building 22xI4, and is not satisfactory as a permanent residence. The Council is putting on a lean-to, laying on the water and making it as comfortabe as possible. The two doors mentioned in my/estimates for re airs etc will not be charged to the Department, as the Council is standing all expences regarding repairs. The Council will rent this house for ten dollars (\$IO.OO) per month, and keep it in repair. After a suitable house is provided for the teacher and nurse, I would recommend that the Department still rent this house as an office and living quarters for the agent when at Skidegate. It is very unsatisfactory to have to do all business in private houses, as a present.

Regarding a permanent residence for the teacher and nurse, the Skidegate Council ask that their Trust fund be used for this purpose, and that they rent the house to the Department for Twenty dollars (120.00) per month, to be ppid to the Treasurer of the Council each month. The Council would be responsible for the upkeep and repairs. This meets with the approval of the whole XIX village. If the Department agrees to this, I would a preciate having an early reply, so that the house could be built before all the villagers scatter for the fishing about May.



When at Skidegate recently, I interviewed the new teacher, Miss Wright. She is an elderly lady, and xakk seems rather eccentric. She refuses to share a room with any other person. She is at present living in the house which Miss MacRae and Mrs, Gladstone occupied. There is only one bedroom and medicines are also kept in the same room room. The elergyman, Mr. Matthews does not care to board the teacher. When the new Murse arrives, there will be the question of accommodation. There is, however, a suitable borge in the village which can be purchased for 1200.00. This house is in goo condition. Only one bedroom is completed, but another one could be finished off, and other work such as boarding in around the foundation, and a room finished as a dispensary, for approximately \$250.00 for labour and material. This would give six rooms, which would socompodete both the Teacher and Murse. I asked Merses a anitable standard Mitchell and Currie, who built the Massett School, for an estimate on a suitable for two people, and they gave the figure, \$2300.00. The house mentioned above, would also be large enough to accommodate an extra teacher when required. It is owned by an Indian by the name of James McKey, and is in a good location, close to the School. I would recommend that this house be purchased.

There is a fair sized lot fenced in around the building.

If the Department decides to purchase the house, I would appreciate a wire, so as to give the party time to move out, and have the alterations made, im case a new Nurse should arrive.

Memorandum:

For some time the Department has been renting a residence for the teacher at the Skidegate Indian Day School. When a nurse was appointed for this reserve, she lived with the teacher; but the arrangement was unsatisfactory, as the house was too small. In January of this year, the Indian Band requested the Department to use their Trust Funds for the erection of a residence for the teacher and the nurse and to allow the Band \$20 per month rental. This suggestion was not approved, and the Department informed Indian Agent Gillett that we would try to secure an appropriation for the purpose of erecting a suitable residence for these workers.

Miss Wright, the present school teacher, is no longer young and is a little eccentric, according to Mr. Gillett. She, apparently, refuses to share a room with any other person. Mr. Gillett recommends that we purchase a residence erected in 1914 on the reserve, which is for sale. The price is \$1200 and, with another \$250, it can be finished, decorated and prepared as a residence for the two workers and as a dispensary. Blue prints of this building have been forwarded and Mr. Orr and myself wish to recommend that purchase be made. Funds can be found at the present time from this year's appropriation.







I am enclosing herewith the Bills in connection with the repairs to the Nurse's and Teacher's residence at Skidegate. The amount is slightly over the estimate I gave, but I have had three bedrooms made on the second floor, so as to provide for the accommodation of a possible second teacher. On the ground floor there is a kitchen, pantry, dispensary, and dining and sitting room combined. I neglected to make any provision for the building of a chimney, so for the present stove pipe has been purchased and put in. I think, however, that a brick chimney would be better and safer, although very few houses in the village have them. I will find out the actual cost of one, and report on this later. The only outstanding bill in connection with this residence, is for the moving of the furniture and drugs etc., from the old place. This has not yet come to hand.



I have to point out also that you have not answered the enquiry in official letter of the 22nd Februaryas to "whether the house has been rented, and if so by whom it will be occupied?" Information on this point should be supplied.

The Voucher submitted requests payment in favour of the Skidegate Council. In the event of the issue of a cheque the Department wishes to be informed what the Council would do with the money if paid to them If it is the Council's desire that the money be used for the benefit of the band in general it seems advisable to leave it for the present to credit of the bandaccount, and later on application can be made for expenditure in a judicious manner, so that the Indians in general may benefit from the use of the money.

Replying to the Departmental letter No.157-11-8, of Feb. 22nd, 1929, I beg to say that the material mentioned in voucher No. 401 was purchased in January 1928. The Skidegate Council at that time fixed up the building so that the teacher and nurse could occupy it. Up until that time they had been boarding at the Mission House, but this arrangement was found unsatisfactory. As no other house was available at that time, the Council repaired the place with the understanding that the Department would rent it for the teacher and nurse, and the rent paid directly to the Council, which would compensate for the material and labour on the repairs. The rent however, has been paid into their Trust Fund.

There were no receipts sent in with Voucher 401 as the Council had purchased the material, and the receipts were not kept. The items in Voucher 401 were copied from the Council's books at Skidegate. Matthew Williams, the Hardware merchant, has since given me a receipt for the material which was purchased at his store. According to the Council's books the shingles and lumber was purchased from various individuals in the village and at Queen Charlotte City. No bills were secured from the different parties. The material was used in respixing the building, woodshed and toilet, and I certify to the correctness of this statement.

Mr. C. C. Perry, Assistant Indian Commissioner, has forwarded your letter to him regarding the repairs required to the teacher's residence at the Skidegate Indian Day School.

In this connection I have to say that the Department will have no funds to provide for the cost of the material and labour in staining the roof. You may, however, incur an expenditure not exceeding approximately 366 in the purchase of the flooring required - 1,000', nails and labour. You may also have the following incidental repairs carried out:

Stove repairs, New drain, Window pane and labour.

You should arrange for the purchase of the materials. Indian labour should be employed as far as possible.

Please obtain itemized accounts, in triplicate, covering the cost of all materials; also prepare vouchers, in triplicate, for the labour employed. You should state thereon the number of days or hours employed and the rate paid. These accounts you should attach to proper voucher forms, certify in the usual manner and forward for payment.

This work should be carried out during the present summer holidays.
