

I have the honour to enclose herewith lists of Ahousaht school children, as directed in your letter of January 30th, 1940.

In referring to the report of Capt. Barry in connection with proposed day school at Ahousaht, the situation has not been materially changed by the destruction of the residential school.

The two class rooms remain, but will require some repair at an approximate cost of \$90.00, and I quite agree that these buildings would not be worth transporting to another site. The residence referred to was built by the Department, although on Church property, and was not much damaged by the fire. This could be used as a residence for the teacher if necessary, and I would strongly recommend that the teacher be a married man whose wife is a qualified nurse.

My reason for this lies in the fact that for many years a nurse has been employed at the school, and the natives have become dependent upon her for every minor illness and treatment, and unlike those at other reserves have lost their native self-


The proposed site for the new school is very good except for water and it would be necessary to dig and protect a well, as the water supply on the reserve is very poor.

Dear Major MacKay:-

I would refer you to the contents of Departmental letter 159-2-5 in regard to the construction of an Indian Day School at Ahousaht, West Coast Agency. Mr Hoey's letter is dated January 8th.

The present Ahousaht Indian Residential School is the property of the Woman's Missionary Society of the United Church of Canada. It is not located on an Indian Reserve, but to the south of Mark-to-sis Indian Reserve, Ahousaht Band No. 15, and situated between the small bay and the lake as shown on Plan 3 of the Clayoquot Sound Indian Reserves in your possession.

At the present Ahousaht Indian Residential School there are two classrooms located in a simple long building with windows all on one side. This building is worth very little, and in any case being on United Church land is not the property of the Department. I much doubt that in any case the material would be worth taking apart, transporting some half mile along a board walk through the woods to the middle of the Ahousaht village.

The teachers of the school at present live in the residential school building, which will of course be useless to us when the new Alberni Indian Residential School building is ready for occupation.

At the present Ahousaht Residential School there is a good house for the Missionary or Principal. This was erected late in 1936 I believe for it is first mentioned in my report on the school dated April 15th 1937, see confidential covering letter.

On Page 17 of my School Survey, West Coast Agency, forwarded to you in its final form on January 31, 1938 I recommended the erection of a one room day school at Ahousaht, and large enough to accommodate 35 pupils.

It was explained that this site is on the sea, and has large village greens on each side, a path at the rear or village side and the sea in front. As previously suggested the teacher could no doubt have room and board at the fairly new house used at present by Mr A.E.Caldwell, provided that the United Church intends to locate a Missionary at Ahousaht.

If the United Church is unable to provide accommodation for a teacher it will be necessary to change the type of day school and to include a residence for the teacher. The Department may consider that in any case this would be better. In this case the type of school erected at Pemberton would be best and a cement basement would be necessary.

The location suggested above for the new Ahousaht Indian Day School is within a few hundred yards of the whole of the Indian homes.

Apart from the list of pupils who will be available in September 1940 for such a school at Ahousaht, and which you can obtain of course from Mr. Indian Agent Ashbridge, I believe that I have covered most of the points raised by Mr Hoey. If the school is to be of the size I recommend and taught by one teacher, probably a girl, there ould be no need for provision of a Manual Training room. Should it be decided to add a teacher's residence as at Pemberton, provision could be made for Manual Training in the cement basement then necessary. necessary.

I hope that the information given here together with that in my previous reports on the West Coast Agency educational needs will enable the Department to gain a fairly accurate picture of the conditions.

I would refer you to the contents of Departmental letter 159-2-5 in regard to the construction of an Indian Day School at Ahousaht, West Coast Agency. Mr Hoey's letter is dated January 8th.

The present shousaht Indian Residential School is the property of the Woman's Missionary Society of the United Church of Canada. It is not located on an Indian Reserve, but to the south of Mark-to-sis Indian Reserve, shousaht Band No. 15, and situated between the small bay and the lake as shown on Plan 3 of the Glayoquot Sound Indian Reserves in your possession.

At the present Abousaht Indian Residential School there are two classrooms located in a simple long building with windows all on one side. This building is worth very little, and in any case being on United Church land is not the property of the Department. I much doubt that in any case the material would be worth taking apart, transporting some half mile along a board walk through the woods to the middle of the Ahousaht village.

The teachers of the school at present live in the residential school building, which will of course be useless to us when the new Alberni Indian Residential School building is ready for occupation.

at the present ahousaht Residential School there is a good house for the Missionary or Principal. This was erected late in 1936 I believe for it is first mentioned in my report on the school dated April 15th 1937, see confidential covering letter.

I am anxious to secure from you the fullest possible information in respect to the construction of an Indian day school at Ahousaht. In the 1340-41 estimates, despite drastic reductions in every branch of the government service, including onr own branch, we succeeded in retaining an item of \$3,500 for the construction of a school at Ahousaht to serve the pupils now in attendance at the residential school at that point. It is my understanding that a teacher's residence, the property of the United Church, already exists on the Ahousaht site. We have no information at our disposal, however, to indicate whether already exists on the Ahousaht site. We have no information at our disposal, however, to indicate whether or not the present school is actually located on an Indian reserve. If the present buildings are on a reserve, would it be necessary to purchase a site for the new school? Should this school have full basement accommodation for vocational instruction? Would it be possible to secure a sketch of the site, the location of the present buildings and the distance of the school buildings from the Indian homes? I should like to know, also, to what extent we will be able to secure lumber from any of the present buildings that may be abandoned when the new school is erected. when the new school is erected.

If you can find a favourable opportunity to discuss this matter with Inspector Barry, I feel confident both of you will have a fair idea of the information we are anxious to secure. The building of an Indian day school at Ahousaht is part of the policy agreed upon by the dovernment and the United Church when it was decided that the Coqualeetza school should be used in future as a sanatorium for the care of Indian patients suffering from tuberculosis. A list of the pupils of school age in the Ahousaht district and the approximate distance of their homes from the school site should be sent forward. sent forward.



Dear Sir:

I am in receipt of your letter of the 21st ultimo enclosing letters from Inspector Barry and Indian Agent Ashbridge with reference to the proposed Indian day school at Ahousaht.

Authority has already been issued for the expenditure of \$90.00 for repairing the building to be used for day school purposes between now and the end of June, 1940.

It has been decided to allow the two teachers salary at the rate of \$850.00 a year each from the date on which the day school was opened until the end of June, 1940. While the teachers forwarded questionnaires they did not state the exact date on which they began duties at the day school. This information is necessary before salary can be paid to them. Please let me know at once. I presume that both of them understand that they will only be employed at Ahousaht until the end of June. It is possible, of course, that the authorities of the United Church may recommend their appointment at other Indian schools in British Columbia.

I have read the suggestions contained in your letter regarding the erection of a new day school at this point. In this connection I would refer you to my letter of January 8 last in which you were informed that \$3500.00 was being provided for the construction

of this school. Our estimates were not considered before Parliament was dissolved and consequently I am not in a position to state definitely at the present time if this amount will be provided but I am inclined to feel that such provision will be made. In the meantime you should make arrangements to secure the site which you consider most suitable for this school.

Do you consider that this building should be built under the direction of the Surveys & Engineering Branch or could the Agent supervise its construction provided we erected it by day labour with a competent foreman in charge? Personally I prefer the latter method. If, however, you recommend construction under the direction of the Surveys & Engineering Branch it will be necessary to complete the attached building data form.

I have noted that it will be unnecessary to erect a teachers' residence.

- (6) The two classrooms forming part of the Ahousaht Indian Residential School unit are quite old and any arrangements for the lumber they contain that might be useful in the construction of the proposed Indian Day School would have to be made with the United Church authorities who own these buildings. It is not considered much of this lumber would be serviceable for our requirements.
- (7) As the proposed school would be erected in the village it would be within easy reach of all the children.

I trust the foregoing together with the information supplied by Inspector Barry and Mr. Ashbridge will be sufficient to meet the Department's requirements in this matter.

Provision was made in the appropriation for the current fiscal year for an amount of \$3,500.00 to erect a new day school at Ahousaht, B.C.

I have been in communication with Indian Commissioner MacKay and he states that a plain, one-roomed school to accommodate 45 pupils is all that is required. He further recommends that the building be erected by day labour in charge of a competent foreman-carpenter. There are several capable Indians who can be employed on this work.

I should appreciate receiving the Minister's authority to authorize Indian Commissioner Mackay to proceed as soon as possible with the erection of this building and to purchase the materials required from firms on the approved list.

Regarding the foreman-carpenter Major MacKay recommends Mr. Llewellyn of Esperanza. He is stated to be a capable carpenter and builder and his employment would be satisfactory to Commissioner MacKay.

I had an opportunity on the 15th instant to discuss with Mr. Indian Agent Ashbridge the subject matter of your letter of April 27th and beg to advise that construction of this school can be undertaken by Indian labour under supervision of a white carpenter foreman. There are several capable men among the Indians at Ahousaht who are available for employment in connection with this construction.

Mr. Ashbridge has recommended Mr. Llewellyn of Esperanza as foreman carpenter at a salary of \$7.00 per day. Mr. Llewellyn is reported to be a capable carpenter and builder and has just completed the new hospital building at Esperanza. The employment of Mr. Llewellyn would be satisfactory to this office.

Construction can be undertaken as soon as the materials are made available at Ahousaht. A plain one room school to accommodate up to 45 pupils, with cloakroom and porch entrance, is all that is required. As soon as the requisite authority is received, I shall proceed to secure quotations on the materials required.

I should appreciate being advised if the employment of Mr. Llewellyn would be satisfactory to the Department.





It has occurred to me that the situation referred to by the Department could be met by diverting the funds set aside for the new day school at Kitamaat for such purposes as are now found necessary. There is no urgent need of a new day school at Kitamaat and as pointed out before, construction there should not be undertaken in any case until a decision with respect to the continuation of Kitamaat as a Residential School has been reached by the Church authorities. If it comes to a question of a choice as between Ahousaht and Kitamaat, it would be more satisfactory and meet a more pressing need if a school at the former place were provided.

I have to refer to your letter of May 30th enclosing a copy of a letter from Rev. R. B. Cochrane, Secretary, Board of Home Missions, United Church of Canada, in the matter of a location for a Day School at Ahousaht.

I may say that the suggestion that one or more of the remaining buildings of the Residential School unit be used as a Day School was considered some time ago and it was decided then that the site was too far from the village and as a considerable expenditure would be required to put the buildings in condition for our requirements, it would be desirable for these and other reasons to build the school in the Ahousaht village itself.

My own opinion is that the distance from the village to the old Residential School site is too far for the children to walk, especially in cold, wet, stormy weather, of which they have considerable on the West Coast. This distance would not be considered too great in settled communities or in an open farming country, but there are certain risks in having children traverse such a distance through uninhabited densely wooded country by trail, that should not be overlooked. There is no doubt in my mind that the attendance would be much better if the school were located in the village, and the presence of the teacher daily among the Indian people should be helpful to them in many respects. After careful consideration of all the circumstances, I am satisfied that it would be in the best interests of the Indians and the Department to build the school in the village, as proposed, and would appreciate receipt of the Department's decision in this matter at an early date.

Dear Major MacKay:

I have considered with care the Department's airmail letter 159/36/5, dated May 30, 1940, with reference to a suggestion of Reverend R.B.Cochrane that no new Indian Day School be erected in the village of Ahousaht, West Coast Agency, but that rather the proposed Indian Day School be carried on in one of the two rooms formerly used as classrooms at the Ahousaht Indian Residential School.

I should like to point out to you that should the old classroom or classrooms be used the Ahousaht children will have a daily walk of some mile on a raised plank walk through the woods to and from school. I fear that accidents, children falling off planks, etc., quite likely to occur.

with the Day School so far from the Indian village it will be almost impossible to keep up a good percentage attendance while if the school were conducted in the Ahousaht village itself, the attendance would certainly be better and the teacher would be in a position to exercise a certain amount of control by visiting Indian parents in their own houses.

It should also be remembered that if we are to conduct an Indian Day School in this district it would be far better to have it located on the Indian Reserve itself than on property belonging to the Woman's Missionary Society of the United Church of Canada, over which we have no control.

I have the honor to refer to your letter of June 6th in connection with the proposed day school at Ahousaht. The class rooms in use at the present time are situated on the site of the old Residential School which is church property and approximately three quarters of a mile from the village. These classrooms are badly constructed, poorly ventilated and lighted.

To modernize these rooms would mean spending considerable money on remodelling and repair, which money could be spent to better advantage in a Department owned school.

The people of ahousaht cannot be said to be healthy and the children are not robust. I quite agree with Captain Barry that children having to walk a long distance in wet weather and being obliged to sit in a classroom with their present defects is detrimental to their health and also to school attendance.

Having the school at the village would bring the teacher into closer touch with parents, ensure better attendance. I would respectfully recommend that the new school as proposed be built at Ahousaht Village.

It is observed that authority has been requested by the Agent to provide a midday meal for the children owing to the distance of the school from the village.



I have the honour to refer to your letter of December 16th, 1940, in connection with lighting plant at Ahousaht Day School.

This plant is not operated by batteries but by generator and gasoline engine, and the same has been a continual source of trouble and expense over a number of years, being old when first installed.

As light is required for this school only for a few months of the year and only for about one hour daily, I would respectfully recommend that three Coleman lamps be supplied, which would adequately meet the needs of both school and residence.

"May I also draw your attention to the fact that the lighting plant at Ahousaht is out of commission, and they have to use coaloil lamps to light the residence and the school. I think you might very well consider fixing this up."

You will note it has been suggested that we should fix up this matter. Would this involve new batteries or what expenditure would be required? It is not our practice to supply lighting outfits for Indian day schools. Consequently if this is what is meant no such action can be taken. However, the Department is prepared to supply a reasonable number of Coleman lamps if you consider that they would give better lighting than the coaloil lamps which are now stated to be in use.

ledge your letter of April 18th, 1941, and to report on the Ahousaht Day School as follows:

The old classrooms at present in use are situated about one-quarter mile from the village and are part of the old Residential School, and presumably the property of the United Church. Classrooms are poorly constructed and, apart from doors and windows, would be of little value if torn down and taken to a new site.

It is not thought that the attendance at the Ahousaht School will at any time exceed twentyfive pupils, and it would be more economical to build a new
schoolroom than to utilize the old buildings, with the
exception of doors, windows, furnishings and desks. Reconstruction could not be carried out until late in the year, as
the Indians are away on the fishing grounds from May to
October, and I feel sure they would expect payment for labor.

Residential School the Indians have opposed the day school, and have sought admission for their children to both the Christie and Alberni Residential Schools on every pretext.

Present classrooms have been put in good order and in so far as their construction will permit, and new heater and lighting provided. Also rubber boots were provided for the children to keep them dry during the wet season, and mid-day meal given to eliminate the necessity of going home at mid-day.

In view of these conditions, I would respectfully recommend that the present classrooms be retained for at least another year, and the allowance for mid-day meal extended.

#### Re: Ahousaht Indian Day School

I have for acknowledgment a letter dated March 29, 1941, and also copy of a resolution passed by the Ahousaht Band, attached thereto.

It is noted that in this resolution the members of the Band ask for the construction of a new Indian day school at the Ahousaht Village.

No provision has been made in the estimates now before Parliament for the construction of Indian day or residential schools anywhere in the Dominion, and it is not at all likely that funds will be available for the construction of an Indian day school at Ahousaht at any time in the immediate future. In view of this fact, I have been wondering if the demolition of the present school and its reconstruction near the village has ever been seriously considered. I am aware, of course, that the existing building is somewhat old and dilapidated, but it has occurred to me that if the Indians are really interested in the education of their children they might undertake, during the summer months, the dismantling of the old building and the construction of a building at the village. A building reconstructed in this sense might not be ideal for educational purposes, but it might be suitable for their needs until times become somewhat normal. I am making this suggestion on the understanding that the labour costs involved would be borne by the Indians. We have no item in our estimates that would enable us to assume payment of the labour costs involved in the reconstruction of this school.

Sir:

I have the honor to refer to your letter of June 6th in connection with the proposed day school at Ahousaht. The class rooms in use at the present time are situated on the site of the old Residential School which is church property and approximately three quarters of a mile from the village. These classrooms are badly constructed, poorly ventilated and lighted.

To modernize these rooms would mean spending considerable money on remodelling and repair, which money could be spent to better advantage in a Department owned school.

The people of Ahousaht cannot be said to be healthy and the children are not robust. I quite agree with Captain Barry that children having to walk a long distance in wet weather and being obliged to sit in a classroom with their present defects is detrimental to their health and also to school attendance.

Having the school at the village would bring the teacher into closer touch with parents, ensure better attendance. I would respectfully recommend that the new school as proposed be built at Ahousaht Village.

Dear Major MacKay:

I have considered with care the Department's airmail letter 159/36/5, dated May 30, 1940, with reference to a suggestion of Reverend R.B.Cochrane that no new Indian Day School be erected in the village of Ahousaht, West Coast Agency, but that rather the proposed Indian Day School be carried on in one of the two rooms formerly used as classrooms at the Ahousaht Indian Residential School.

I should like to point out to you that should the old classroom or classrooms be used the Ahousaht children will have a daily walk of some mile on a raised plank walk through the woods to and from school. I fear that accidents, children falling off planks, etc., quite likely to occur.

With the Day School so far from the Indian village it will be almost impossible to keep up a good percentage attendance while if the school were conducted in the Ahousaht village itself, the attendance would certainly be better and the teacher would be in a position to exercise a certain amount of control by visiting Indian parents in their own houses.

It should also be remembered that if we are to conduct an Indian Day School in this district it would be far better to have it located on the Indian Reserve itself than on property belonging to the Woman's Missionary Society of the United Church of Canada, over which we have no control.

I beg to acknowledge receipt of your letter of the 5th ultimo with reference to the Ahousaht Indian Day School and the resolution of the Band asking for the con-struction of a new school in their village, in connection with which you advise that no provision had been made in the Estimates for the construction of any new school and that the Band might consider demolition and re-erection of the school near the village.

This matter has been taken up with Mr. Indian Agent Ashbridge and I enclose herewith his letter of the 1st instant, also letter of Mr. Inspector Barry of the 7th instant, from which it will be observed that the suggestion is not considered practical.

Under the circumstances, I would recommend that the matter be left in abeyance until such time as funds are available for the construction of a new school or the Reserve has been inspected by the Inspector of Agencies.



The old classrooms at present and are part of the old Residential School, and presumably the property of the United Church. Classrooms are poorly constructed and, apart from doors and windows, would be of little value if torn down and taken to a new site.

It is not thought that the attendfive pupils, and it would be more economical to build a new
schoolroom than to utilize the old buildings, with the
exception of doors, windows, furnishings and desks. Reconstruction could not be carried out until late in the year, as
the Indians are away on the fishing grounds from May to
October, and I feel sure they would expect payment for labor.

Residential School the Indians have opposed the day school, and have sought admission for their children to both the Christie and Alberni Residential Schools on every pretext.

Present classrooms have been put and new heater and lighting provided. Also rubber boots were provided for the children to keep them dry during the wet going home at mid-day.

would respectfully recommend that the present classrooms be retained for at least another year, and the allowance for mid-day meal extended.

Dear Doctor Dorey:

#### Ahousaht Indian Day School.

I have for answer your letter of May 7th with regard to the above Indian Day School.

As I advised you in our telephone conversation of this morning our District Inspector of Indian Schools for British Columbia has previously recommended that we consider the erection of a new Day School at this point. Due to previous commitments, it is not anticipated that this building will be erected this summer. However, it is high on Inspector Davey's list of required schools for British Columbia and it is expected that it will be included in our 1949-50 Estimates.

In view of the above recommendation, the Department would like to be advised further with regard to the views of those members of the Women's Missionary Society who were of the opinion that a Residential School should be built at Ahousaht.

Will you kindly grant authority for the purchase of an oil heating stove for the Ahousat Indian Day School. This school was supplied with a wood burning heater but it is found that wood cannot be obtained for this stove. A quantity of wood was secured last summer but this will have all been used before the end of January. Miss Moats as well as myself have endeavoured ot obtain the services of some Indian to procure wood for this school but this we have been unable to do. Great difficulty is experienced in all places along the coast where wood is required.

I would recommend that as there is an oil station adjacent to the Reserve that they be supplied with a oil heating stove.

During my recent trip to Toronto I had a long meeting with Dr. Derey and officials of the Woman's Missionary Society of the United Church.

while we primarily discussed the closing of a residential school in the Prairie Provinces, we also discussed a number of matters in British Columbia. One of these dealt with the payment of rental on the church building used as a school at Ahousaht. Apparently, the Church has never received any rental for this building.

They also requested that we give consideration to the erection of a new school at Ahousant this summer. Unfortunately, we have not a sum in our Estimates for its erection but I would suggest that we place it in the Supplementaries. If it is at all possible to arrange a transfer of funds from another project, this might be one to which you would give consideration.

Dear Doctor Dorey:

You will recall our conversation concerning the building of a new school at Ahousaht this year. As you are aware, only 50% of our funds were voted before Parliament prorogued. As a result we have had to limit our building programme accordingly and I cannot now definitely assure you that this school will be built this summer.

I know this will be disappointing to the Woman's Missionary Society, as indeed it is to me. However, these are matters over which we have no control and we will do everything possible to make the school more comfortable ment winter.

A new oil heater has recently been supplied to the school, in an effort to improve heating conditions. As you are aware, we were unable to obtain the services of an Indian to sesure sufficient wood for this school. There is an oil station adjacent to the reserve, so we feel that at least things will be more comfortable for the teacher.


